

America's Boating Course

Boating Recipes by Valerie Buffum: A Italian Sandwich Option

While sandwiches of all sorts are a staple on boating menus, the following version elevates the sandwich to a new level, thanks to the magic of Italian cooking.

The following recipe comes from "The Yachting Cookbook" by Elizabeth Wheeler and Jennifer Trainer. The book is filled with great recipes for both on the water and on shore. This sandwich can be prepared at home and packed up for a picnic lunch; or the ingredients can be assembled on board soon after breakfast and ready for lunch. The proportions are for four people, so double the ingredients for your larger crew.

Tomato and Mozzarella Sandwiches on Italian Bread

- One-pound fresh mozzarella cheese, thinly sliced; or substitute Brie, goat cheese, Havarti, or other soft cheese
- 4-6 tablespoons Garlic Vinaigrette (see recipe below)
- Freshly ground pepper
- Crushed red pepper
- One-pound loaf long Italian or French bread
- 2-3 firm ripe red tomatoes
- Lettuce, arugula, or basil leaves, washed and dried

Layer the sliced cheese in a bowl with 2-3 tablespoons vinaigrette and season with pepper and crushed red pepper

Slice the loaf of bread lengthwise, without cutting through, so that it is hinged. Pull out the soft inner crumbs from the loaf to make a slight hollow and brush the insides generously with the vinaigrette.

Slice the tomatoes into 1/8-inch-thick rounds. Place overlapping slices of the tomatoes and cheese on one half of the bread, and sprinkle with a little vinaigrette. Cover with lettuce. Close the sandwich and wrap tightly in waxed paper or aluminum foil. Put the sandwich under 10 pounds or so of weight for about an hour to distribute the flavors and moisture through the bread.

To serve, cut the loaf crosswise into manageable slices.

Variations: In addition to the

tomatoes, layer the cheese with any of the following: slices of marinated olives, artichoke hearts, anchovies, slivers of red onion, or thin slices of ham, salami, or prosciutto.

Garlic Vinaigrette

- ½ cup red wine vinegar
- 1-2 large garlic cloves, peeled and lightly crushed
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion or shallot
- ½ teaspoon dried oregano or marjoram
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh parsley
- ³/₄ cup olive oil

Combine the ingredients in a container with a tight-fitting lid and let stand for at least 2 hours. When the vinaigrette has the desired garlic flavor, fish out the garlic cloves.

More About the Spanish Virgin Islands

Footnotes from Mike Cranna

This is a follow-up to the March *Beacon* article and the April membership meeting presentation (it wasn't recorded) to capture some additional highlights and observations from the trip. The group had not sailed together before, but settled in well, each contributing their experience and skills, not necessarily related to sailing.



Pre-sail planning helped a lot when it came to provisioning. The boat briefing had been

arranged for the evening we arrived, thus allowing an early departure the next morning from St. John, BVI.

The destination for the first day was the island of Culebra, approximately 30 miles. Arriving late in the afternoon, we anchored on a grassy bottom in Ensenada Honda, a well-known hurricane hole, just off the small town of Dewey. Customs & Immigration check-in was handled via the ROAM app. We spent a day lounging on Playa Flamenco, a world-renowned beach, and checking out the Sherman tank, a relic from the naval training on Culebra.


Our next destination was Isla de Vieques, with its wild horses roaming the island. We enjoyed the local fare at Bananas, near where we anchored off the quaint town of Esperanza. That evening we took a very memorable guided kayak tour of Mosquito Bay, where we experienced the famous bioluminescence. The effect would have been more brilliant had the moon not been nearly full that night.

Vieques is living with the legacy of decades-long naval gunnery practice, with lingering and unknown risk of unexploded ordinance. This is perhaps a reason why these beautiful islands have been slow to develop as travel destinations. Vieques is a Superfund site, with an estimated 57% reclamation complete.

The island has a reputation for good fishing along the south coast, particularly with the sea floor dropping off to over 1,000 ft less than 2 miles offshore. We tried our luck during most of our charter. We caught and released 2 barracuda; and kept 1 False Albacore, which was very tasty seared on the grill. We returned to Culebra for a final relaxing night in its Mosquito Bay on the south side of the island.

The return to St Thomas was very uncomfortable, with 20 plus knot winds and choppy seas, and a small craft warning. The high winds were reportedly unseasonal, and locals compared the condition to "Christmas winds" that are common in late December.

These are beautiful islands, remote, and uncrowded, although reputed to be a busy weekend destination for Puerto Rico residents in the summer. They are "undiscovered" and have been compared by some to the BVI of 25 years ago. Consider leaving a person on the boat when anchored in high winds. We sailed both a monohull and catamaran during this charter. Consider a catamaran even for sailing – they are very spacious, and comfortable. Remember, "stuff" will happen, so a plan B (maybe even plan C) is good to have in your pocket.


